



### Bristol Old Station, Temple Meads, Bristol

**Details** The British Empire & Commonwealth Museum is situated in a prominent location in the Temple Quarter, Bristol. The museum itself is housed within Bristol's historic former railway station, designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel. Completed in 1840, it is the world's earliest surviving railway terminus, and includes the passenger shed and the adjoining former engine and carriage shed. This Grade I listed building has been nominated as a World Heritage Site.

Knight Frank's South West Planning and Development team was appointed to provide a Planning Strategy Paper. The Paper provided the museum's trustees with an assessment of current and emerging planning policy for the site, together with a clear strategy on how best to maximise its future development.
